What is Dyslexia?

- Learning difficulty characterized by trouble decoding (sounding out) words.
- Difficult word recognition and spelling.
- Significant difficulty with fluency, comprehension, rapid naming, vocabulary, and written language.
- High risk for falling behind peers in academics.
- The most common reason smart kids struggle to read.
